Coach Rick Mantz is one of the most accomplished football coaches in New Jersey high school history. His tenure at Hillsborough high school is a brilliant example of that achievement. Coach Mantz has the rare honor of being a Hillsborough High School State Champion in football as a player on the 1980 Hillsborough State Championship team, and as a Head Coach of the 2000 Hillsborough High School State Championship Team. While at Hillsborough, Coach Mantz lead the Raiders to an 81-39 record. 2 of his players, Shaun O'Hara and Shawn Mayer, rose from Hillsborough High School to play at Rutgers and Penn State before they eventually went on to play in The NFL.

After Hillsborough, Coach Mantz lead South Brunswick high school to a 31-11 record. He lead South Brunswick to their first ever share of their division crown and their first ever playoff victory. During his time at South Brunswick, Coach Mantz coached Mohamed Sanu who played college football at Rutgers and is currently continuing his football career with the Atlanta Falcons in the NFL. In 2012, Coach Mantz was Inducted into the New Jersey State Coaches Hall of Fame. Currently, Coach Mantz serves as Director of High School Relations for the Rutgers University football program.
